Job Title: Camp Medic

Reports to: Medic and Safety Manager

Position Purpose:

The Camp Medic at CampOUT plays a crucial role in providing health and safety services to campers and staff, ensuring their well-being throughout the camp session.

Essential Job Functions:

- **Health Care and First Aid Services:**
 - Under the direction of the Medic and Safety Manager, provide health care and first aid services to meet the needs of camp staff and campers.
- **Medication Management:**
 - Assist in the management of daily medication administration.
- **CPR and First Aid Coverage:**
 - Offer CPR and First Aid coverage as needed at designated times and locations.
- **Direct Care:**
 - Administer direct care to staff within the scope of their skills, following the camp's health care manual and treatment procedures.
- **Health and Safety Practices:**
 - Monitor and assist in maintaining health and safety practices while working in various areas throughout camp.
- **Preparation of Athletic Areas and Waterfront:**
 - Prepare athletic areas and waterfront, ensuring adequate water, sunscreen, and other preventive materials are available.
- **Hygiene Supervision:**
 - Assist in ensuring campers practice proper hygiene before entering the dining area.
- **Risk Management:**
 - Collaborate with other staff to minimize or eliminate health and safety risks.

Other Job Duties:

- May accompany campers off-site for clinic visits.
- This position may be combined with another role, such as Counselor, with specific duties outlined for first aid duty and primary position focus.
- Attend staff meetings and complete training sessions, and all paperwork as required in a timely manner

Relationships:

Medical staff generally have regular relationships with all head of medical and safety, camp counselors, guardians, other medical and mental health staff, leadership, and camp director.



Equipment Used:

Medical staff may be asked to use fire protection equipment, safety equipment, medication management and lock boxes. Some may be asked to drive camp golf carts and hold confidential camper information.

Qualifications: (Minimum Education and Experience)

- Registered nurse (RN) with a license as required by that state law
- Current first aid certification
- Current CPR certification.
- Experience in first aid and emergency management services.
- Valid driver's license.
- Must be at least 21 years of age.
- Candidates must have the ability to pass a background screening, with the associated costs covered no sooner than 60 days prior to the commencement of the camp.
- Must submit a health history record by camp deadline

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Experience in providing care for both children and adults in cases of illness or injury.
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to remain calm and act quickly in emergency situations.
- Enthusiasm for working with youth and promoting camp safety.
- A genuine desire to work with the camp's target population.
- Knowledge of community health practices.

Physical Aspects of the Job:

- Ability to lift and assist campers and staff.
- Proficiency in reading and following directions on medication labels, health forms, physician orders, and parent letters.
- Skill in maintaining a written record system.
- Capability to quickly reach remote locations on camp property over uneven terrain.
- Aptitude for observing and assessing sanitation and safety conditions at the camp.
- Endurance to meet emergency needs effectively.
- Willingness to work outdoors in various weather conditions.
- Willingness to live on-site in cabins with campers during camp sessions and work irregular hours when required.

The Camp Medic position at CampOUT is crucial for ensuring the health and safety of campers and staff, and it requires a combination of medical expertise, compassion, and the ability to respond effectively to a wide range of health-related situations and medication distribution to campers.
